3. Covid-19 Vaccine	A pediatric Covid-19 vaccine has been approved for use in Canada. The Pfizer vaccine has been approved for use in children ages 5-11. The Durham Region has informed us that mass immunization clinics are open by appointment until December 18, 2021 and that pop up clinics will be scheduled at a later date. A consideration for by-law changes to allow vehicles to park on Fallingbrook has been brought forward to the Town of Whitby and will be tabled in the new year. 6. Other	Human Trafficking continues to be a serious concern in Durham Region. The average age of recruitment is 12-13 years old. Victim Services of Durham Region in partnership with the Durham Regional Police Services, host Youth Prevention Workshops for grade 9 students explaining healthy relationships, how to set boundaries, consent and how to recognize red flags. Recently the school board has agreed for these workshops to be made available to elementary school children in grade 8.
